MAKING THE WORLD'S BIGGEST AND BEST SKI AREAS MORE FUN

Every year France's ski areas invest huge sums in modernising their ski areas with the latest cutting-edge developments to make them more efficient and more comfortable. This year sees a focus on increasing accessibility to beginners and turning up the fun factor.

EVER MORE PLAYFUL AND INVENTIVE

The mountains of France are unmatched in terms of variety and sheer breath-taking beauty. France's resorts do everything they can to show these mountains off to the maximum! Les 2 Alpes will open the "Skywalk"- a panoramic footbridge at 3400m altitude giving unrivalled views of Mont Blanc to the north, the Ecrins National Park to the South, La Meije to the east and Vercors massif to the west! Peyragudes in the Pyrenees (filming location for Tomorrow Never Dies) has built a new panoramic piste called, fittingly, "La 007". The "Selfie Tour" in Châtel allows the snap-happy neo-narcissist to discover the ten best selfie spots across the ski area!

Many resorts are adding a variety of obstacles, mascots and surprising additions to turn their runs into veritable adventures, particularly for youngsters. Among the latest for the 2016-2017 season are two new pistes in Valloire featuring giant bells and xylophones to bash with your pole, thus composing an extended skiing symphony on the way down! In Mont Dore in the Auvergne, skiers can test themselves against a range of challenges on the new "Entrainement de Gaulois" piste, while Combloux has a new run featuring live replays from a sequence of webcams.

Watching kids ski, it quickly becomes clear that they're mad about doing jumps and catching air- big kids and grown-ups too! New and improved boardercross runs- pistes with added contours such as banked corners, waves (a.k.a "woops"), jumps and more are springing up all over the place. The "Pirate

Adventures" fun zone in Valmorel is the latest (and the resort's 3rd boardercross).

Once the stomping grounds reserved for highly skilled expert skiers and snowboarders doing unfathomable tricks over huge jumps, snow parks have been radically democratized so that now they are accessible to all, from superhero to nervous novice. La Clusaz' "Family Run" will be the perfect environment for young and old to try their hand at freestyle. In the Pyrenees, Font Romeu will open "Fun Run", "Run 66" and "Skicross Zone"- all with the beginner freestylerinmind. Meribel, whose "Moonpark" is one of the best-known snow parks in the Alps, is launching a brand new family concept for winter 16-17... Stay tuned!

Sauze in the Southern Alps has comprehensively redeveloped its various fun zones, while Avoriaz's "Stash" run (a piste featuring all manner of wooden obstacles to jump, slide and tap), named by CNN as the best run in the world in 2014, has been extended into the forest in the direction of Morzine, making it an even better badweather option.

FOCUS ON BEGINNERS

Anyone can learn to ski, at any age. Thousands of new skiers young and old strap on skis for the first time every year. The major common denominator is that like Arnie, they vow they'll be back! For these skiers, and anyone not comfortable skiing on steep or busy slopes, resorts have built special "zen", "calm" and "tranquil" areas. The names speak for themselves- these are safe and controlled areas for people that are just starting out and want to take their time.

Two new developments catch the eye this year, among others. Le Grand Bornand has spent 1,460,000€ on redeveloping its Plateau de Rosay sector to optimise its beginner ski experience, while Tignes has introduced a pass giving free and unlimited access to its green slopes.

ESF (French Ski School) has developed a range of courses designed to appeal to new skiers to the game, either with friends or as a family, with a wide variety of disciplines and ways to learn. Groups taught by girls exclusively for girls, introduction to skitouring, off-piste or freestyle, cross country skiing, to name but a few.

SNOWMAKING

Widespread investment to ensure optimum snow conditions.

In order to ensure that visitors can ski safe in the knowledge that the quantity and quality of snow is up to par, resorts are constantly and upgrading their snowmaking facilities.

Morzine, Saint Gervais, Courchevel, Peisey-Vallandry, Valmorel, Villard de Lans/ Corrençon, Les Menuires and Praz de Lys Sommand are among the resorts to invest this year in new and improved equipment that ensures that as much of the ski area can be opened in excellent condition every day.

Les Gets has installed cutting-edge GPS and radar technology on its grooming machine, enabling them to pinpoint the exact snow depth at any given point and concentrate their efforts with pinpoint precision.



NEW AND IMPROVED ACCOMMODATION OPTIONS

The HO is a crucial part of the holiday experience, as a base camp from which to plot your next mountain mission or to recuperate from a hard day on the hill. All manner of new and improved accommodation options are opening this winter, run by families that have honed their mountain hospitality for generations and dynamic new arrivals, raring to go. The common denominator is that they are all passionate about the mountains, know what skiers need, and are prepared to go the extra mile in order to ensure that the time spent off the mountain is every bit as good as the moments on it.

CHALETS

Classically styled buildings in stone and wood, the chalet is the quintessential picture-postcard French mountain experience.

Spotlight on three new chalet concepts.

- The 5* **Chalet Skadi by Village Montana** in **Val d'Isère** opens December 17th 2016 and promises to democratize the chalet experience, with all the bells and whistles you'd expect from a high-end chalet, but with options sleeping 4, 6, 8 and 10.
- The **Chalet des Amis** in **Peisey Vallandry** is a comprehensively renovated and repurposed building steeped in history. Formerly known as the "Maison de la Montagne", it was the meeting point for high-mountain guides setting off into the Vanoise National Park, it now features six spacious 110-170m² chalet apartments for 8-14 people.
- After the success of his ultra-hi-tech Chalet Quezac, which opened in 2014, 4x freeride world champion and decorated rally-driver **Guerlain Chicherit** is opening a second chalet in **Tignes** Les Brevieres. More details to follow, but we should expect it to be even more cutting-edge than the original!

HOTELS

- The building formerly housing the Hotel Mercure in **Val Thorens** has been totally refurbished and will reopen as the edgy 4* boutique hotel **Fahrenheit Seven.** Simultaneously modern, vintage and cozy it promises to be the latest great addition to Val Thorens' emerging upmarket hotel game! Open November 25th 2016.
- **Les Arcs** opens its first 5* hotel this year, the 48-room **Taj-I-Mah**. The architecture is designed to invite a maximum of natural light inside. Michelin-starred chef Eric Samson will welcome guests in a choice of two restaurants, while a 400m² spa and wellness area awaits those partial to pampering. Opens December 16th 2016.
- Two new additions further cement **Courchevel's** place at the top of the tree as far as luxury hotels are concerned. The 5* **Barriere les Neiges** of the Barriere, Leading Hotels of the World group features 42 contemporary designed rooms and suites. The 5* **Hotel K2 Altitude** (formerly Hotel Kilimandjaro) is decked out in a Himalayan theme
- René and Maxime Meilleur, owners of the 3 Michelin-starred **La Bouitte** in **Saint Martin de Belleville** have spent 1m€ on a partial refurbishment of the property's boutique hotel rooms, taking its famed farmhouse luxe to the next level.





ONWARDS AND UPWARDS

Alongside the new, there is no shortage of improved properties that have renovated, restored or embellished their offerings. In **Peyragudes** in the Pyrenees, the **Résidence Privilège** (Lagrange Vacances) re-opens after two years and 3.5m€ of refurbishments. Also in the Pyrenees, the **Hotel Mir** in **Saint Lary** has been awarded its 4th star. The **Hotel Crychar** in **Les Gets** has its eyes on a 4th star too, having created six new luxurious rooms and suites, as well as a new roof-terrace for guest to enjoy an aperitif beneath the stars. **Hotel Les Escondus** in **Vars** has been awarded a 3rd star, as have three hotels in **Saint-Gervais Mont Blanc**.

NEW TOURISM RESIDENCES

Self-catered apartments in "Residences de Tourisme" remain the staple for the vast majority of skiers in France. Winter 2016-2017 sees the opening of a host of new properties to suit every budget:

- La Clusaz: 5* Residence Les Cimes (Groupe PVG) and 4* Residence Le MendiAlde (half residence, half 4* hotel)
- La Plagne: 4*Front de Neige (Odalys)
- La Rosière: 4* Chalet les Marmottes and 4* Résidence Roc Noir
- Les Menuires: 4* Le Cœur des Loges (MMV)
- Le Grand Bornand: 4*Le Roc des Tours (MGM)
- Les Saisies: Prestige Village Les Armaillis





A breath of fresh air and a complete change of scenery in which to escape.

What could be more refreshing than getting away from it all and staying as close to nature in the mountains as the winter will allow?

- Les Nids Des Vosges in Gerardmer in the Vosges mountains have added a new treehouse cabin complete with panoramic sauna and bubble ceiling to observe the stars, making it the ultimate mountain treehouse!
- The tiny resort of Saint Pierre de Chartreuse near Grenoble is opening two new piste-side treehouses designed to blend in perfectly with their surroundings. Both these and Les Nids are of course comprehensively insulated to ensure complete comfort all year round
- Go back to basics at the Chevrerie du Chatelard and stay in the brand new eco-friendly gypsy carryags in Meaudre in the Vercors massif
- In Morillon and Praz de Lys Sommand, Eco-Gites Leyetaz is offering new independent chalets featuring fully ecologically-responsible construction.
- Val Thorens welcomes its first eco-luxe B&B La Datcha, which features a wide variety of stylistic influences, to reflect the cosmopolitan tastes of its multi-lingual owners.
- Just up the hill from Besse in the Auvergne is the completely refurbished and dreamy Gîte L'Estivadoux. In the heart of Saint Nectaire (cheese) country, it is has the mountains and lakes of the Auvergne on its doorstep.

ALTERNATIVE STORY IDEAS

A few outside-the-box story ideas that caught our eye. These are mostly one-off snapshots-feel free to contact us for further info or similar examples.

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The mountains make a fabulous studios for artists. Several painters and photographers base themselves in and draw inspiration from the mountains for their work. Exhibitions and wide-ranging artistic events are put on throughout the seasons, with the mountains as spectacular frames. In Mont Dore in the Auvergne, the completely rehabilitated Joseph Foret cultural centre will host a Dali exhibition. Val Thorens opens a new zen and culture centre with a 200m² area dedicated to art. French resorts often have a strong artistic drive. Les Menuires is working on a project in collaboration with "light architect" Laurent Fachard. In many cases, the design and architecture of new buildings in resort fits right into the art category, with the current trend being for buildings that blend seamlessly into the surrounding environment- the Mille 8 complex in Les Arcs and the Aquamotion centre in Courchevel being excellent examples

VIP service

All visitors to France's mountain resorts are VIPs, so the resorts are constantly innovating and adapting to provide services that facilitate guests' holidays. Concierge services are the major new trend, either included in new self-catering residences (e.g. Village Les Armaillis in Les Saisies) or external that anyone can use (e.g. La Conciergerie in Val d'Isere which offers a private lounge and salon as well as a wide range of services available throughout the holiday). In Grand Tourmalet in the Pyrenees, the conciergerie is virtual- on Twitter. "Do I need to put chains on to get up to the resort?", "how do I check the kids into the daycare centre?", "where do I meet the instructor for ski school?" Advisors are on hand to provide the answers via Twitter in real time. More and more resorts now offer live chat in several languages on their

Total Zen



Yoga is a growing trend in the mountains, which represent an outstanding setting in which to practice the discipline. Faced with magnificent landscapes, it's easier to unplug and meditate. Yoga & Ski breaks are available in Arêches Beaufort while Les Gets offer yoga lessons to kids from 4 and up. Morillon and Val Thorens offer yoga as part of a mountain walk in snow shoes. In Valmorel, Nordic walking, a gentle and healthy activity is blended with yoga and learning breathing techniques. Last year saw the installation of France's first dedicated yoga-on-skis piste. Yoga poses, it turns out, are widely achievable with skis on, which helps prepare the body for all sliding sports! ESF Morzine has beginner sessions. On the pistes themselves, "Zen" areas are popping up all over the place, for those that prefer to ski at a more sedate, contemplative pace.



-**4**-Ski outfit Rental

La Bresse Hohneck in the Vosges mountains was France's first resort to rent technical clothing to first-timers, to remove the cost of buying ski clothing for those who fancied trying their hand. But Alpe d'Hueztakes it further and with a different target market in mind. Two ski shops in the resort have a range of vintage flouro ski suits available to rent, perfect for those that love to dress up on the slopes and evoke the sartorial glory(!) days of vesteryear!

Stuff with weird names...

Horse-boards, Sled Dogs, Fat'Trott, Ski-hok, Snooc, Yooner. What on earth are we talking about? Good question! These are fun new quirky family-friendly activities that offer new sensations and ways to approach the simple pleasure of sliding on snow. "Fat'Trott" is a large scooter with fat wheels that can be ridden down the pistes once they close in several resorts, including Saint Gervais. Fat Bikes are their pedalled cousins, offered by dozens of resorts in each of France's 5 mountain ranges. Sled dogs, a Norwegian concept, are offered in Les Gets. For those keen on being the first to try new sports, Ski Hok is a new-born discipline offered in the Isere region, mixing elements of snow-blades and touring skis. Similarly the Snooc, a brand new invention from an inventor and entrepreneur from Chambéry, combines ski-touring tech on the up and sledging on the down. The activity remains exclusive to France and is available in Le Grand Bornand. Without forgetting the Bun-J ride in Tignes-part ski jumping, part bungee jumping, part zip wire, or husky sleighs, offered by dozens of resorts and a huge hit with kids.

-5-Craft beer from the



The mountains are awash with craft beer. Hooray! Brewed with water direct from glaciers, flavoured with the taste of the mountains and enjoyed beneath splendidly peaked panoramas, there is no better place to enjoy quality beers. Brasserie du Mont Blanc has multiple world-champion beers at the World Beer Awards. The Brasserie Galibier in Valloire is France's highest craft brewery. Arrivissante from the Aravis region (La Clusaz & Le Grand Bornand), Lombarde from the Haute Maurienne, 21 (as in the 21 hairpins climb) to Alpe d'Huez, La Sorcière from Orcières are all artisanally made to the highest standards and are wonderful ambassadors to their respective home resorts! Brasserie Alphand near Puy Saint Vincent is the brainchild of former French team elite downhill racer Luc Alphand. The Bec Jaune Brewery in Morzine is run by a former brewer from "Bermondsey's finest" Kernel brewery (and is one of Morzine's hottest new addresses to eat and drink). No sign of the craft beer trend slowing down in the mountains in other words!

-<mark>8</mark>-Digital detox

Even on holiday people find it hard to disconnect, turn off the smartphone... and be on holiday! The mountains are the ideal environment to step away from the office, properly. Certain hotels are on board with this approach and offer to lock the phone in a safe upon your arrival! In the Vercors massif, digital detox stays are available with the express purpose of disconnecting.

-**6**-Man vs Wild

Certain resorts offer veritable survival courses for those looking to push their limits. La Clusaz's Survival Techniques Academy is approved by Bear Grylls, and encourages participants to exit and expand their comfort zone with full courses or initiations, accessible to anyone, including adventurous families. Orientation in the wild, constructing a shelter, management of stress and cold, clever survival tricks. New ways to approach and understand the mountain environment. In Gerardmer in the Vosges, adventure course teach you how to make drinking water and offer fun "commando" courses.

-9-Easy access

Both Chambéry and Grenoble boast international airports on a human scale, with regular flights from the UK. Both are within touching distance of a multitude of major resorts, served by direct and inexpensive bus transfers. France's top snow-sportsmen and women know this better than mostathletes like Brice Roger (ski racer), Ben Valentin (halfpipe skier), Marion Haerty (freeride snowboarder) and Clemence Grimal (halfpipe snowboarder) are working with Chambéry airport this winter on a special campaign.







EVENT CALENDAR 2016-2017

LA GRANDE PREMIERE

VAL THORENS, 26TH-27TH NOVEMBER 2016.

Along with Val d'Isere and Tignes, Val Thorens is the first resort of the season to fire up its lifts, on November 26th. 2016 sees a new opening weekend fiesta celebrating all things snow with parties, gear testing of everything from ski touring to snowboard equipment, the Rock On Snowboard tour and plenty more across the weekend.

RISE FESTIVAL

LES 2 ALPES, 10TH-17TH DECEMBER 2016

Now into its third year, this mountain music festival hosted by the organisers of Ibiza Rocks is one for the dance music fans. Last year's headliners included Sigma Live and Skream, the 2016 edition promises to be the biggest yet, with stages all over the resort, legendary day parties at apres ski bars across the ski area and all-night afterparties at the clubs in town.

GRANDE ODYSSÉE SAVOIE MONT BLANC

7TH-19TH JANUARY 2017

The most spectacular dog-sledding race in the world, the 2017 edition spans two weeks, 10 stages and a dozen resorts, including Les Carroz, Les Gets, Megève, La Plagne, Val Cenis, Aussois and Bonneval sur Arc.

« 6 STATIONS RUGBY TOURNAMENT »

MID-FEBRUARY 2017

An epic rugby sevens tournament on snow featuring legends of the sport, played in 6 resorts, including Valmorel, La Clusaz and Val Thorens. FIVE KEY TRENDS

Over-arching trends gathering pace in resorts across France for winter 2016-2017.

. Authenticity

Back to basics. The main ingredient is the mountains. From the towering peaks to the lush forests of the Alps and Pyrenees to the volcanoes of the Auvergne and the splendid rolling hills of the Vosges and the Jura, the mountain-scapes of France are spectacular. The views are superb, the lifestyle and heritage are special and the personalities striking. Whether in the vast ski areas of Haute Savoie and Savoie, watching the sunrise in solitude from the roof of the Pyrenees, on the sweeping plateaux of the Vercors or in cosy and confidential corners of a village resort, one is guaranteed a fabulous change of scenery and an authentic experience in any of France's 5 mountain ranges (Alps, Pyrenees, Massif Central, Vosges, Jura). The resorts of Montgenèvre, Méribel, Villard de Lans/Correncon, Peisey Vallandry, Le Grand Bornand and Val d'Allos are pautting a particular focus on getting back to the roots and rejuvenation this winter.

2. Playful

Reflective doesn't necessarily mean inactive, nor does a mountain holiday necessarily have to be a ski holiday. There's something active for everyone, regardless of interests and budget. Sliding on the snow is course the quasi-constant, with a variety of equipment, snowy surfaces, activities and sensations being developed. Active folks can get out and about, uphill and down, on a whole host of skis, snow-shoes, bikes, sledges, on foot... Mountain spaces are enhanced by spectacular lighting, surprising soundscapes and every year the arrival of new activities gives rise to new ways to experience the mountains. Resorts particularly well suited to the diverse-of-interest include Les Gets, Orcières 1850, Val Thorens, Besse Super Besse, Le Mont Dore and Praz de Lys Sommand.

3. Nordic

There's no need to jet off to the Artic if you want to immerse yourself in a natural Nordic experience. At Christmas in particular, one is inclined to wonder if Santa really does live in Lapland, or whether in fact he's been hiding in the mountains of France all along! Nordic activities too are in the grip of a sort of modernising revolution. Secured and dedicated ski-touring tracks accessible to all are becoming de rigeur in several resorts, while more and more ski schools are offering courses to get people out into the untouched backcountry with a guide. Also on hand in ever more resorts are teams of eager husky-dogs,

desperate to whip you off to pristine and wild places in a sled! The mountains of the Jura and the Vosges are excellent spots for husky adventures, as is the Vercors massif in the Isère region. For ski-touring, Arêches Beaufort, Sainte Foy Tarentaise and La Clusaz are excellent choices..

4. Heritage

Many French resorts were trailblazers at their inception and remain at the forefront of ski resort excellence today. Avoriaz turns 50 this year, which is an opportunity to celebrate its remarkable history as the first of its kind and a unique ski resort concept. Located atop a huge cliff, built in a striking and unique style- at once futuristic, avant-garde, retro. The resort was labelled one of the great architectural and heritage developments of the 20th century by the French Culture Ministry in 2003, and winning prizes more recently as the world's best family resort, most innovative in sustainability (World Ski Awards 2013 & 2014), world's best run- The Stash (CNN, 2014). Val Cenis and Superdevoluy both celebrate their 50th birthdays this year too, while St Gervais Mont Blanc and Alpe d'Huez blow out 80 candles in 2017. Each will have special festivities to celebrate. Alpe d'Huez is marking the occasion by announcing an ambitious 350m€ project to refurbish the urban space to make the village more ergonomic and sustainable, modernise the lift network, and most excitingly, eventually link the ski area with Les 2 Alpes and Les Sybelles. Dizzying in scope, the project would make the ski area by far the biggest linked area in the world. One to follow for sure!


5. Digital

Social media is an increasingly crucial part of every facet of people's lives, including (or especially) on holiday. Resorts are pulling out all the stops to facilitate the taking of amazing photos. "Selfie Tours" in Châtel and Val Thorens and breathtaking man-made structures are two approaches to this end. In Val Cenis and Aussois, by scanning one's ski pass, a machine takes a hi-res photo which is then emailed to the skier. Villard de Lans also has a free photo on the slopes system. A restaurant in Les 2 Alpes has a special box installed at 2600m for the same purpose. Video parks immortalise the exploits of skiers and snowboarders over the course of a whole run and can be found in Les Gets, Font Romeu, Peyragudes (both Pyrenees) and Vars, whose 7 snow parks make the resort one of Europe's best for freestylers.



EASY ACCESS

Easier than ever for winter 2016-2017!



Winter 2016-2017 sees the opening of 6 brand new routes and two existing routes being expanded to match demand. The Pyrenees are the big winners, with 3 new routes into Toulouse bringing 18 flights per week servicing the resorts of the Pyrenees which, clearly, are developing guite the following in the UK.

www.altibus.com is the information portal and booking website grouping France's alpine bus transfer companies. Transfer can be booked from the airports of Geneva, Lyon and Chambery, as well as from 20 major train stations, to over 80 resorts in the French Alps.

TRAVELLING BY TRAIN

Passionate British skiers love the direct Snow Train or travelling by train via Paris. Both allow for a departure on a Friday evening, arriving at the crack of dawn on a Saturday, and leaving on the evening of the following Saturday, meaning 8 days skiing are possible compared to the tradition 6 afforded by travelling by air. A variety of French resorts are easily reached by train, none more so than Les Arcsthe Snow Train from St Pancras delivers skiers from the centre of London to Bourg St Maurice, where skiers hop on the short funicular into the heart of the resort. No airport transfer needed, at either end!
